Your non-response, unwillingness or unavailability to meet at this time will prevent you and your wife from being granted permission to attend this evening's service.

Tonight's meeting will be for purposes of opening communication and setting the times and parameters for on-going discussions regarding the matter. The committee has always and continues to regard matters such as these to be ecclesiastical in nature, and certainly hopes to resolve this according to biblical authority. Therefore no recording of any kind, nor legal or other counsel will be allowed to participate or be present at tonight's meeting, or any future meeting concerning this matter.
